Some Variations Vocabularies

Roles for controlled vocabularies

- Assist with cataloging
- Provide collocation of like resources
- Facilitate browsing
- Expand user queries

Infrastructure needed

- For full integration of controlled vocabularies into cataloging tools and end-user interfaces
 - Faceted vocabularies
 - Robust syndetic structures
 - Openly available vocabulary files
 - Real-time querying of vocabularies via Web Services

All of these are in progress, but NONE is quite there yet.

What can we do?

- Catalogers, managers, and system designers must work collaboratively
- Remember why controlled subject access is valuable, but be flexible as to how it is implemented
- Streamline controlled vocabulary creation process as much as possible
- Learn about the technologies involved
- Make our vocabularies available openly for machine access
